* The SOAS Silk-and-Bamboo Ensemble

Silk-and-Bamboo (SiZhu/SihJhu) is a genre of music associated with the teahouses of ancient China. The musicians are generally amateurs whose music forms the background sounds of the city's famous teahouses, played while other patrons chat over cups of tea, melon seeds and games of Chinese chess.

The SOAS Silk-and-Bamboo Ensemble took shape gradually during the mid-1990s with the arrival of a number of Chinese music devotees as students or researchers. In recent years SOAS students have been able to learn this music as part of their degree courses.

The Silk-and-Bamboo group's current teachers are Steve Jones (an expert on Chinese instrumental music) and Rachel Harris (currently a lecturer at SOAS). Also performing today will be Elmar Beining (sansian; lute), Emily Edmonstone (dizih; flute), Catriona Lachlan (siao; vertical flute) and Wang Shih-Yin (sheng; mouth organ).
